

Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat

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Synopsis

ACL 1 The story of Joseph comes from Genesis 37-46. Two Narrators tell the story of Joseph, a dreamer (*Prologue* and *Any Dream Will Do*). They introduce Jacob and his 12 sons from Canaan (*Jacob and Sons*) and explain that Joseph's brothers are jealous of him for his coat, a symbol of their father's preference for him (*Joseph's Coat*). It is clear from Joseph's dreams that he is destined to rule over them (*Joseph's Dreams*), and so, to get rid of Joseph and prevent the dreams from coming true, they attempt fratricide but, circumstantially, instead they sell Joseph as a slave to some passing Ishmaelites (*Poor, Poor Joseph*), who take him to Egypt. The brothers then lie to their father Jacob about Joseph's 'death', showing him Joseph's coat covered in (goat's) blood as 'proof' (*One More Angel in Heaven*).


In Egypt, Joseph is the slave of the millionaire Potiphar. Over time, Potiphar trusts Joseph enough to run his house. However, when Mrs. Potiphar makes advances, Joseph spurns her and Potiphar jumps to conclusions when he sees them together. He immediately jails Joseph (*Potiphar*). Depressed, Joseph sings *Close Every Door* - but his spirits rise when he helps the stricken Butler and Baker (Pharaoh's servants) interpret their dreams. (*Go, Go Joseph*).

ACL 2 The Narrators talk about impending changes in Joseph's fortunes (A Pharaoh's Story) because the Pharaoh is having uninterpretable dreams. Now freed, the Butler tells Pharaoh about Joseph and his dream interpreting skills (Poor, Poor Pharaoh). Pharaoh orders Joseph to be brought in and the king tells him his confusing dream (Song of the King).

Joseph interprets the dream as seven plentiful years of crops followed by seven years of famine (*Pharaoh's Dreams Explained*). Pharaoh puts Joseph in charge of ensuring Egypt can survive the famine and Joseph becomes the second most powerful man in Egypt (*Stone the Crows*).

Back home, the famine has caught up with Joseph's brothers, who express regret at selling him and deceiving their father (*Those Canaan Days*). They hear Egypt still has food and decide to go there to beg for mercy and to be fed, not realizing that they will be dealing with Joseph (*The Brothers Come to Egypt*). Joseph gives them food, but decides to test them by planting a cup in Benjamin's sack (*Grovel*, *Grovel*). Joseph angrily stops them from leaving, asking about the "stolen cup". As Joseph searches, it is revealed that Benjamin has the cup. After Joseph accuses him (*Who's the Thief?*) the other brothers beg for mercy, asking Joseph to punish them instead (*Benjamin Calypso*).

Seeing their selflessness and penitence, Joseph reveals himself (*Joseph All the Time*). He sends for his father so all are reunited (*Jacob in Egypt*), sealed by Joseph's reflection (*Finale: Any Dream Will Do (Reprise)/Give Me My Coloured Coat*). This is followed by a rock/disco medley of most of the musical's major numbers (*Joseph Megamix*).





Graeme Bennett director

"May I return to the beginning" sings Joseph. These words seem strangely relevant to me. 'Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat' was the first theatrical production that I was ever involved in. The place was Camperdown High School; the year was 1985. Playing the dual roles of Jacob and Pharaoh, I was well and truly bitten by the acting bug, and so began many years of involvement with the theatre. The story of *Joseph* has always been a sentimental favourite of mine, and not just because of that production so many years ago. Adapted from the traditional biblical story, 'Joseph' is a narrative of pride, greed, jealousy, lust and love – a timeless tale indeed. Coupled with incredibly infectious, toe-tapping music from the pens of Andrew Lloyd-Webber and Tim Rice, we have all the key ingredients for a wonderful theatrical experience.



Bringing this production to the stage has been a mammoth effort and my huge thanks goes to everyone who has contributed towards making it a reality. We have exceptional talent here in our local community and working with such talented people has made my job an absolute joy. It has been a great honour for me to take on the role of director for this production on behalf of the Camperdown Theatre Company and I sincerely hope that you leave our performance with music in your ears, joy in your hearts, and a spring in your step!

Jack Quail (15) Keyboard 1



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
